Giving to Home Mission enables:-

- Grants to local churches supporting church planting, renewing local churches and funding mission grants.
- Regional Associations, such as the EMBA, who are engaged in missional development in the area, supporting new initiatives and churches and supporting the on-going work of churches and their Ministers and families.
- Three national specialist teams who resources churches in their work through legal, ministries and mission support.

Every Baptist Church is encouraged to give a minimum of 5% of its income or £40 per member to Home Mission every year.
