I have served as Moderator of the EMBA Directors since July 2015. I continue to work closely with the Staff Team seeking to provide support and encouragement to local churches during challenging times. My role includes overseeing the appointment of staff and guiding the Directors and Staff Team through the process of a Strategic Review to ensure that the EMBA is fit for purpose in a digital age. I am a member of BU Council. I served EMBA as Moderator of Langley Mill Baptist Church from 2011 to 2017.
